VIETNAM VETERANS DAY 2003

Tony Stepney 2781795, first intake National Service 1965-1967, served with 6 RAR D Company at the Battle of Long Tan.



Tony went to Vietnam on the 8th June 1966 and returned to Australia on the 14th June 1967. Tony laid the first wreath at the Cockscomb Veterans Camp Vietnam Veterans Day on behalf of his mates and 6 RAR D Company.

Numbers grew as cars filled the parking areas, buses rolled up and a general buzz of Veterans meeting old buddies and mates grew louder and louder, an estimated 180-200 Veterans and families took part in this years service at Cockscomb.

Calling together the service **Tony Dawes Ex 104 Sig Sqn.**, took control of the morning. The Catafalque party mounted the Memorial at 1055 and at 1100 the sound of a helicopter could be heard. Not just a coincidence, but a special flyover by **Pilot Officer Ryan Marr of 162 Recce Flight Townsville**. The Kiowa made several circling passes over Cockscomb and brought back some incredible memories for those on the ground. Hairs raised on the neck, tears in the eyes and incredible smiles on the faces of Vietnam War Veterans. No doubt the highlight of the morning and something our Veterans will remember for weeks to come.

Our thanks to Range Control Shoalwater Bay, Task Force Head Quarters 1 Brigade Darwin, 162 Recce Flight Townsville and Pilot Ryan Marr - mission accomplished As the Service unfolded, Tony spoke of Australia's involvement and of the ongoing 10 year war, of the casualties and the cost in human life. Why we recognise the 18th August as our Day of Remembrance and then he read out the names of the ten new plaques for the Cockscomb Memorial (see page 3).

Chaplin Kaye Ronalds, a Major with 11th Brigade and a serving member of the Uniting Church told us that she was at primary school while the Vietnam War unfolded and that a member of her family was drafted for National Service.

Tony recited the Ode to the Fallen, a chilling reminder that has sent many a man to remember his mates at war.

The last post echoed though the campsite and surrounding bush; played by **Graham Ivers Salvation Army.** A minute of eerie silence and then Rouse.
